

## Concordia Electric and LREA announce scholarships for 2021

Dewayne Bailey, General Manager and CEO, along with the Board of Directors of Concordia Electric Coop. Inc., are pleased to announce that they will be awarding 10 scholarships and Louisiana Rural Electric Association will be awarding 5 scholarships in the amount of \$750.00 each. The application is available to seniors graduating in May 2021 who plan to attend college in the fall. They must be a resident of the cooperative's seven parish service area, which includes Caldwell, Catahoula, Concordia, Franklin, Grant, LaSalle, and Tensas.

Students interested and who meet the eligibility requirements can pick up an application at the Jonesville office between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:30 pm. Winners will be selected in a random drawing by the Board of Directors at the August Board Meeting, tentatively scheduled for Thursday,

August 12, 2021.

The following are requirements that must be met in order to be eligible:

1. Applicant must be a Concordia Electric member or a child or legal ward of a Concordia Electric member who has been in good standing for at least 48 months. (Only one \$750.00 scholarship will be awarded per family per year.)
2. A student can only receive the Concordia Electric scholarship one time. It is not renewable. The term of the scholarship will be for one academic year beginning with the fall semester or quarter.
3. The scholarship money can only be used by undergraduate students to attend, on a full-time basis, any Louisiana public institution of higher education.
4. A first-time college student applying for the scholarship must have graduated from

high school with at least a "C" average.

5. Along with the application, applicant must provide Concordia Electric with an official high school or college transcript verifying their eligibility.
6. The \$750.00 scholarship will be paid to the recipient at the beginning of the student's first semester or quarter upon presentation of an official receipt for the payment of full-time undergraduate tuition. The receipt or fee schedule must clearly identify the recipient and college or university by name.

### AVAILABILITY OF LOW-INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE FUNDS (LIHEAP)

LaSalle Community Action Association, Inc. is announcing the availability of funds dedicated to assist eligible low income households with their energy payments for residents of Catahoula Parish. All applications are taken on a first come, first served basis. Telephone appointments will be taken Thursday April 15th, 2021 from 9 a.m. -11:00 a.m. and every month thereafter on the 3rd Thursday OF EACH MONTH from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. until ALL funds are exhausted. To schedule an appointment, you may call: 318-389-4810. An eligible household is one whose total income is at or below the levels listed in the table below and who have not been served in the current benefit season. Applicants must provide, at a minimum, the following documentation at the time the application is taken: (1) Social Security cards for all members of the household (2) Proof of income of all household members (3) a copy of the most recent utility bills (4) a photo I.D. of the applicant (5) copy of lease agreement (6) Proof of present address reflecting the service address indicated on the energy bill. Additional documentation may be required. Households reporting Zero Income must provide additional documentation. All information provided is subject to verification. Intentional misrepresentation of information may result in criminal prosecution of the applicant and anyone assisting in the misrepresentation.

There are reasonable accommodations for those with disabilities.

. Applicants who have received a DISCONNECT NOTICE AND WHO HAVE NOT RECEIVED ASSISTANCE FOR A DISCONNECT IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS, MAY WALK IN WITHOUT AN APPOINTMENT. You must bring the Disconnect notice and the bill that goes with the disconnect notice.
