

The following ordinance was offered by Dorothy Watson and seconded by John Albritton

ORDINANCE

An ordinance creating Consolidated School District No. 10 of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana (the "District"), and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 1371 of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (R.S. 47:1371), authorizes the Parish School Board of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, to create consolidated school districts within the Parish; and

WHEREAS, it is now the wish of this Parish School Board to create a consolidated school district with the boundaries hereinafter set forth and;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Parish School Board of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, for school purposes, that:

SECTION 1. In accordance with the provisions of Section 1371 of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (R.S. 47:137,1), and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, there be and the same is hereby created a consolidated school district within the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, with boundaries co-extensive with the boundaries of Consolidated School District No. 5, School District No.9 and School District No. 12 of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, as said boundaries are presently constituted, less and except that area within the boundaries of Consolidated School District No. 5 south of the left bottom corner of S12T8NR8E in a straight eastward line to 12T8NR8E and that area within said Consolidated School District No. 5 north of the southwest corner of S31T9NR6E (which meets School District No. 9) in a straight line to the eastward to the southeast corner of S36T9NR7E (the intersection with the Tensas River).

SECTION 2. Said consolidated district shall be known and designated as "Consolidated School District No. 10 of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana (the "District"), and the seal of the Parish School Board of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, is hereby adopted as the seal of said District. The governing authority of the District shall be the Parish School Board of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana.

SECTION 3. The District is a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana with all the authority granted by law, including the authority to issue bonds and levy taxes as allowed by law.

SECTION 4. In case any one or more of the provisions of this ordinance shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of said ordinance, but the same shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained herein. Any constitutional or statutory provisions enacted after the date of this ordinance which validate or make legal any provisions thereof shall be deemed to apply hereto.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption.

This Ordinance having been submitted in writing, having been read at a public meeting of the Parish School Board of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, the vote thereon being as follows:

The Police Jury of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, met in Regular Session at its Regular Meeting place, the Police Jury Meeting Room at the Courthouse, on Monday, June 28, 2021 at 6:00 P.M.

Present: President Harold Sones, Vice President Jerel Evans and Jurors Deborah McCormack, Rodney Sones, Jeffery Estes, Debra Hawkins, Rickie Crumpton and Johnnie Adams; Secretary/Treasurer Patti C. Mizell, Assistant Secretary Frankie Tolar and Road Supervisor Charles Atkins.

Absent: Jurors Brady Nelson

A quorum being present, the Police Jury of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the governing authority of said parish, by President Harold Sones, who called upon Rodney Sones for Prayer, and requested that the Jurors and the public remain standing for the Pledge of Allegiance after which the following business was transacted.

On motion by Jerel Evans, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting and adopt same as published in the Official Journal.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Jeffery Estes and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to add the following item to the agenda:

Approve purchase & installation of 2 – 12x30 culverts for Rex Road.

On a motion by Deborah McCormack, seconded by Rickie Crumpton and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to approve the agenda.

President Sones opened the floor for the public comment period on agenda items.

Mr. Brad Borth expressed his concern for Item #9 – salary increase for Class A CDL drivers. He stated he agreed that everybody deserves a raise, but if the parish did not have money to fix roads, where would the money come from to give a salary increase.

On motion by Johnnie Adams, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the following additions to Selective Maintenance:

Area II
Bird Road Limbs in ditch
Area IV
Peachland Lane Ditching

Ellis Boothe, Homeland Security Director, informed the Jury that FEMA has come out with new requirements for disaster related projects such as replacing culverts and road damage. Projects will now require an Engineer to design the project and certify that all State and Federal Codes are being met. He feels that the parish needs to have an agreement with an Engineer for future disaster related projects.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Debra Hawkins and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the purchase and installation of a 24x30 culvert for Wiggins Road.

On motion by Jeffery Estes, seconded by Rickie Crumpton and unanimously passed, the Jury approved a \$1.00 per hour salary increase for Class A CDL drivers.

On motion by Jeffery Estes, seconded by Jerel Evans and unanimously passed, the Jury approved a 25 MPH sign for Owl Road.

On motion by Jeffery Estes, seconded by Deborah McCormack and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the purchase and installation of a 18x26 culvert for Young Road.

The Secretary/Treasurer informed the Jury that the agreement for financial assistance with the Veteran's Office had expired at the end of 2020. The VA office was contacted in January to ask about a new agreement and the status of an officer being in Catahoula Parish since there had not been anyone to staff this office in months. A new agreement has just been received for 2021. There is someone in the Catahoula office every other Thursday for now until they can find a replacement. After discussion the following action was taken by the Jury.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Jeffery Estes and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to table this matter until more information is received on the status of staffing the Catahoula office.

On motion by Jerel Evans, seconded by Deborah McCormack and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the purchase and installation of 2- 12x30 culverts for Rex Road.

President Sones announced that the Police Jury Office and Maintenance Barn will be closed Monday, July 5, 2021 for the July 4th holiday.

On motion by Jerel Evans, seconded by Rickie Crumpton and unanimously passed, the Jury voted there being no further business to adjourn.
