The Police Jury of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, met in Regular Session at its regular meeting place, the Police Jury Meeting Room at the Courthouse, on Monday, December 13, 2021 at 6:00 P.M.

Present: President Harold Sones, Vice President Jerel Evans and Jurors Brady Nelson, Deborah McCormack, Rodney Sones, Jeffery Estes, Rickie Crumpton and Johnnie Adams; Secretary-Treasurer Patti Mizell, Assistant Secretary Frankie Tolar, Office Assistant Tammie Edwards, Road Supervisor Charles Atkins and Attorney Karla Shirley-McHand.

Absent: Juror Debra Hawkins

A quorum being present, the Police Jury of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the governing authority of said parish by President Harold Sones, who called upon Rodney Sones for Prayer and requested that the Jurors and the public remain standing for the Pledge of Allegiance after which the following business was transacted.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Rickie Crumpton and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting and adopt same as published in the Official Journal.

Ms. Dorothy Oliver, Executive Director, LaSalle Community Action Association, spoke to the Jury about the Section 8 Pubic Housing Program. LCAA administers this program for the parish. She stated that funds are available for 66 units at this time, but there are not sufficient landlords to fill this need. There are 34 units occupied through this program. They are also working with the Emergency Voucher Housing funds to assist the homeless to get placed into housing. She stated that the parish has to approve the annual Pubic Housing Authority Plan as required by HUD and is requesting the Jury adopt the 2022 PHA.

Suzie Paulk, Little River Road resident, addressed the Jury about a gate that has been placed and locked on Little River Road that goes to the weir. She stated that she uses this road to go and pick up her grandchildren. She asked if this is a public road. She referenced a lawsuit that had been previously filed in 2004 concerning a similar situation on this road and it was deemed a public road to the LaSalle parish line.

Kaylon Randall stated that he is a landowner on Little River Road and was around when this lawsuit was filed and went to court. He stated that Bobby Denton had placed a gate across the road and this suit was filed against him. It went to court and was declared a public road. He stated that he was told the Corp of Engineers built the road for access to build the weir and the parish was given the road after the completion of the weir. He stated he

didn’t know if there was any paperwork to back this up. He stated that the police jury has been maintained the road to a certain extent. He stated he would like to ask that both gates be opened up to the weir and the jury adopt a resolution to such effect.

Further discussion was held and the Jury agreed to add an item to the agenda concerning this situation.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Johnnie Adams and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to add the following items to the agenda:

1. Approve 2 – 15 MPH signs for Duty Ferry Road
2. Approve 16x30 culvert for Wyant Road.
3. Remove lock from gates on Little River Road.

On motion by Jerel Evans, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to approve the agenda.

President Sones opened the Public Comment Period for agenda items. There were no comments.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Jerel Evans and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to authorize payment of current invoices authorized by the Finance Committee.

There were no additions or deletions from Selective Maintenance.

This is not pledging any parish funds to this program.

On motion by Johnnie Adams, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to send a support letter for the AT&T GUMBO application.

The Jury was presented with November 2021 financial reports which included budget to actual figures.

On motion by Deborah McCormack, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury approved 2 – 15MPH signs for Duty Ferry Road.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to Article IV, Section 21(D)(1) of the Louisiana Constitution, that Cleco Power LLC (“Cleco Power” or “Company”) filed with the Louisiana Public Service Commission (“LPSC”) a proposed Market Value Demand Response Rider Schedule (“MVDR”) pursuant to LPSC General Order dated May 26, 2021 (Docket No. R-35136), to become effective as determined by the LPSC.

Proposed Rider Schedule MVDR is an optional service that provides either a qualifying customer with firm load(s) or an aggregator an opportunity to participate as one or more Demand Response resources in MISO wholesale markets. Customers or aggregators shall not participate as a Demand Response resource in MISO wholesale markets except through the Company’s MVDR Rider. Participation in Rider Schedule MVDR is voluntary. Cleco Power shall be the sole Market Participant in MISO for any Demand Response resources provided by the participant within the Company’s service territory. Cleco Power’s proposed MVDR Rider Schedule will apply in all parishes served by the Company.

The twenty-four parishes through which Cleco Power’s service area extends are: Acadia, Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Catahoula, DeSoto, Evangeline, Grant, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, Red River, Sabine, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Vermilion, Vernon and Washington.
